### Learn to Recognize Signs of a Natural Gas Leak in Your Area

Leaks from a natural gas pipeline are extremely rare. However, it is important to know how to recognize the signs of a leak if one were to occur in your area.

Call Centennial Utilities right away if you notice:

- A “rotten egg” smell from the odorant added to the natural gas
- Vegetation over or near the pipeline which appears to be dead or dying for no apparent reason
- Water bubbling at a creek, pond, river or any wet area
- Dirt being blown or appearing thrown into the air
- Flames or vapors near the pipeline
- Exposed pipeline, which may have been caused by a natural disaster
- Hissing, whistling or roaring sound.

Do not go near the area and keep others away from the site. Do not operate anything that may ignite a gas leak, including cellular phones, flashlights, lighters or two-way radios. Do not move equipment or vehicles in the area as turning them on may also ignite a gas leak. If a vehicle is running, do not turn it off. Do not attempt to shut off any valves or extinguish fires.

After leaving the area, call 763-784-6751 during working hours, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, or after hours 763-427-1212. If those numbers are not available, call 911 and ask for Centennial Utilities.

## Adopt-a-Drain Wayne the Drain, Drainy McDrain Face, and Lola:

Stormwater does not get cleaned before entering our lakes and streams. When water flows off our streets and into storm drains, it carries dirt, leaves, and other pollutants that impact the quality of our water and turn them green with algae.

You can take care of your storm drain by sweeping and raking leaves, sand and dirt, trash, and other debris to allow water to flow easily and cleanly down the drain. Participants in the metro-wide Adopt a Drain program are adopting, naming, and cleaning storm drains to protect water quality. Taking care of local storm drains is one of the easiest ways homeowners, renters, businesses, and volunteer groups can help keep lakes and other local waterways clean.

Remove snow away from your storm drains to ensure water can go down the drain during frequent freeze and thaws; sweep up extra salt and sand. Spring is also an important time to clean storm drains.

Celebrate Earth Day by cleaning up around your adopted drain. Adopting a drain or two is easy – all it takes is a rake and a broom, a dustpan and a trash can, and a few minutes several times a year.
